


As requested by the Iron County Health Department, the Food Pantry will remain open for clients to pick up their food, **CURBSIDE**.

St. Mary's Catholic Church Masses to Resume Public Celebrations Message from Fr. Frank Kordek, OFM

updated 8/6/20

Public Masses have resumed: Saturday, 4pm, and Sunday 7am and 11am. Also, on Tuesdays at 5:30pm and at 8am on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. No Communion Service on Monday at 8am.

No one should feel obligated to attend. If you are high risk or living with someone who is high risk, you should not come. If you need assistance walking you should not come. If you have flu-like symptoms or have been in contact with someone who has had the flu or exhibited symptoms you should not come. If you have had cancer, are diabetic, or have compromised health issues you should not come. Bishop James Powers has dispensed our obligation to attend mass. If you have any of the above situations please stay home, watch our recorded mass found on Facebook page or St. Mary's website. You can still make a spiritual communion:

An Act of Spiritual Communion: My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen. "THANK YOU, JESUS."

We MUST comply with the following Guidelines/Requirements:

The following steps are not only to protect you but all that come to these services and those assisting to provide these services.

- Anyone with flu-like symptoms or a temperature of 100.4 degrees or more, PLEASE STAY HOME.
- Any adults who attends Mass, PLEASE WEAR A MASK.
- As much as everyone will want to see and visit with each other, **DO NOT CONGREGATE OUTSIDE OR INSIDE THE CHURCH to talk to each other**. If you stop to talk to someone, or we get bunched up and Social Distancing goes out the window. **WE CAN BE FORCED TO CLOSE**.
- We MUST maintain the proper **6 Foot SOCIAL DISTANCING** between persons not living in the same household.
- We can allow up to 25% church capacity to enter the church. This allows us to have about 52 people in attendance for each mass. Varying by the number of immediate family members attending.
- There will be **NO** congregational singing.
- Follow ushers'/volunteers' instructions.
- Follow tape guidelines on the floor and in the pews within the church.
- Pews are marked where to sit. 4 persons per pew. The only exception is families in same household.
- <u>Communion</u> All rows of parishioners sitting in pews on right side of the church facing the altar get in line first, then those seated on the left side proceed to the altar next for communion.
- Door monitors will be at the doors to direct and monitor access and exit. They will be wearing masks.
- A basket for your weekly donation/envelopes is on a table as you enter the church.
- Hand sanitizer is at the entrance, exit, and one on aisle table. *Please use it.*
- <u>EXITING after Mass</u> Parishioners sitting in pews on right side of the church facing the altar exit through the side door, those on the left side exit through the back door.
